Block of the Month 7 2024

Thank you to all who have participated in this year's Block of the Month Program. I hope you enjoyed making the quilt as much as I liked bringing it to you. This issue of the newsletter and the guild's website has all the remaining blocks instructions and assembly. I know the Veterans Program would love to receive your quilt but I'm hoping you are making one for you too. Block of the Month 7: Christmas Tree

This block contains four 3 ½" x 6 ½" flying geese. There are several ways to make flying geese; the instructions below are for two at a time. I prefer this method because mine seem to come out right.

Fabric needed:

Tree top: two 7 ½" squares green and six 4 ¼" background squares.

Tree trunk: 2" x 8 ½" brown rectangle and two 2 ¾" x 8 ½" background

Make 4 green flying geese: 3 ½" x 6 ½" (3" x 6" finished).

Place 2 background squares on opposite corners of each green square.

Draw a line diagonally from corner to corner and sew 1/4" on both sides of the line.

Cut on the marked line.

Draw a diagonal line on the two remaining background squares.

Place the marked background square in the exposed green corner and sew 1/4" both sides of the line.

Cut on the line and iron back the background corners.

Square the flying geese to 3 ½" x 6 ½".

Sew the flying geese together vertically to form the top of the tree.

Hint: sew with green side up and make sure you stitch a couple of threads up from where the seam crosses. This will insure you keep your point.

Tree top should measure 6 ½" x 12 ½".


Make the tree trunk.

Sew a 2 3/4" x 8 1/2" background rectangle on either side of the brown one to form the trunk.

Sew the top of the tree to the trunk section. Tree block should measure 6 ½" x 20 ½".









This can be embellished to look like a Christmas tree.

Block of the Month 8: 3 fall leaves

Fabric needed: background and 3 colors for leaves.

Cut one 7" square of each color and three 7" background squares. Cut three 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares of each color and two 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " background squares.

Make four HST of each color with background.

Place two 7" squares of fabric (one color & one background) right-sides together.

Sew 1/4" seam around all 4 edges.

Cut diagonally each way to make four HST.

Sew the squares together as shown to make 3 leaves.

Sew the three leaves together as shown.

Sew a 6 ½" x 1 ¼" background strip to the top and bottom of the block.

Block of the Month 9: Bow Tie blocks

Fabric needed: white and 2 colors for bow ties.

From white: Cut sixteen 2 1/2" squares.

From each color: Cut sixteen 2 ½" square and sixteen 1 ½" x 1 ½" squares.

Make center of bow ties

Sew a 1 ½" colored square to the lower right corner of a background square.

Sew a 1 ½" colored square to the upper left corner of a background square.

To reduce bulk, iron the center seam open.

Make bow ties

Align squares as shown. Sew eight bow tie blocks together.

Strip should measure 4 ½" x 32 ½"









Sew a white or background strip 4 ½" x 4 ½" to each end of the bow tie strip and trim to 4 ½" x 41 ½" Add a background 2 ½" x 41 ½" rectangle to the top and bottom of the bow tie strip.

Square ladder strip

Sew 2 colors (or more if desired) of 2 ½" x WOF together.

Cut strip into sixteen 2 ½" pieces and sew alternating colors together.

The strip should measure 4 ½" x 32 ½".

Sew a background strip $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " to each end of the bow tie strip and trim to $41\frac{1}{2}$ " Add a background $2\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to the top and bottom of the strip.

In my quilt, I did both and sowed one at the top and one at the bottom of the quilt.

McKinney Quilter Guild 2024 Block of the Month


Sew the various blocks together to form the quilt below. I added a $1\,\%$ " inch background strip for an inner border and a $3\,\%$ " outer border. My quilt top measures 50" x 57". A nice size for the Veterans program.

If you are making the quilt for Quilt of Valor, the recommended size is $60'' \times 80''$. It can be no smaller than 55×65 and no larger than 72×90 . My recommendation is to widen the borders to bring the width to the 55'' - 60'' required size. To increase the length of the quilt, select your favorite 10 %'' blocks (there are many 10'' finished star patterns on the internet or use the sawtooth star block below). Make four 10'' finished blocks and sew a 1'' background strip on the left and right of the strip; trim to measure $10'' \times 41 \%''$. Sew a $2 \%'' \times 41 \%''$ background strip to the top. Sew this row between the house row and the square ladder strip. This will add 11 %'' to the length which meets the QOV requirements. Of course, you may vary the additions to fit the size requirements and your own creativity.

10" (finished) Sawtooth Star Block



- 1 Background for flying geese: $3\frac{\sqrt{x}}{5}$
- 2 Color for flying geese: eight 3"x3".
- 3 Center color 4 1/2" x 5 1/2".
- 4 Background corners four 3" x 3".

Make four flying geese to sides. Lay out squares as shown and sew together. Trim to $10 \, \frac{1}{2}$ " square, if necessary


