
Enjoy the warmer weather and keep going through your stash for May! Notions and rulers and other tools can be saved for the Mini Madness sale in October.

MCKINNEY QUILTERS GUILD FEBRUARY 18, 2025

Prior to the meeting Jeannie Neckar demonstrated how to make a Four-Patch Stacked Posies quilt. Thank you, Jeannie, for teaching us a new skill.

The meeting was called to order at 1:00 by Gisele Oakes. She welcomed all members and guests.

There were no changes or additions needed for the January minutes or Treasurer's report. They will be filed for audit.

Roxy Gross – Farmersville Quilt Guild shared their raffle quilt. Roxy welcomed and thanked them. We had 57 people in attendance – six were visitors and two joined the guild. California quilt updates – we received quilts and tops and have someone to quilt them. Plano gave 26 quilts. Roxy will drive them to California.

Betsy Whiteman – Sunshine and Shadows:

Kathy Chambliss has had back surgery (day surgery) and is home from the hospital. The doctor thought the surgery went extremely well.

Suzan Crocker fell off a step and broke bones in her neck (C1 and C2) on Saturday. She is in a neck brace, no surgery, (too dangerous) but they will be working on building her bones back up to stabilize her neck. She will be staying at her son's house to recuperate.

John Baltzer has passed away this week. Please include **Mary Ann Baltzer** and her family in your prayers. Funeral to be held March 2, Sunday afternoon at 2:00pm.

Elaine Henry – Project Linus – Next on agenda are blankets for Camp Dragonfly for children who have experienced loss. These blankets remind them that when you love someone, things you see will remind you of your loved one.

Carolyn Kerr – Ryan's Case for Smiles – 23 pillowcases turned in last month; Bonnie brought 60 today. A de-stasher in McKinney contributed fabrics – enough for 12 pillowcases.

Sharon Wilhelm – Operation Quilted Comfort – got in two quilts today. Sharon calculated that at the January shower, 300 yards of fabric were contributed. Now she has plenty of quilt kits to be made to go to Bonham. Last year we made 101 quilts, more than ever before. Thanks for all the gifts. When asked what size quilts they would like, Sharon told us that wheelchair size quilts and quilts around 45" by 60" were needed (they take 60" by 60" or all sizes but twin size quilts are too large). Directory – Each committee must have co-chair; they need to be determined before next meeting for yearbook.

Jeannie Neckar - Education- Next month Bonnie is going to demonstrate paper piecing before the meeting; Roxy will show us how to make rope rugs later on.

Jean Ann Clarke - May De-Stash Sale – scraps fit in a baggie. Before May, the De-Stash workers will bag up them up for you; after that, you're on your own.

Cynde Quinn – Mini Quilt Auction to be held in October in time for Christmas shopping. It's never too early to start making your mini quilts and other home-made items for the sale table.

Beth Smietana – Introduced Jill Isakson, February's Program. Jill was a member of the night-time McKinney Quilters Guild. Then she went back to work but has now retired and will be returning to our Guild. Jill got started quilting after falling in love with antique quilts and began to make quilts using older fabrics and reproduction fabrics and mostly designs them herself. Generally, she doesn't use a pattern.

McKinney Quilters Guild 2025 BOM

Month 2 – New Album

Fabric Needed:

Blue (A): cut sixteen 2-7/8" x 2-7/8" squares

Blue (D): cut four 5-5/8" x 5-5/8" squares

Red (B): cut sixteen 2-7/8" x 7-3/4" rectangles

Background (C): cut eight 4-1/2" x 4-1/2" squares

Draw a diagonal line on the back of each background square. Cut in half on the line. You should have sixteen triangles.


Using your favorite method, make the center "square-in-square" of the block using four background triangles and one blue 5-5/8" x 5-5/8" square. Trim to 7-3/4" square.

Attach a red rectangle to each side of the square-in-square block.

Attach a blue square to the 2-7/8" side of a red rectangle. Add another blue square to the opposite side. Repeat, making two strips. Attach these strips to the top and bottom of the square-in-square block.

Repeat and make 3 more for a total of four blocks.

Blocks should measure 12-1/2" x 12-1/2".
